

A Short Guide to Homework Presentation

- Homework is due every Tuesday at the start of class. Please keep the challenge problems on a separate sheet and hand them in all at once at the end of the course.
- Every Homework assignment should be stapled before you hand it in.
- Write legibly. You do not have to type your homework but it will be helpful if I can read it.
- Try to keep the problems in order so that I do not need to hunt to find your answer.
- Show your work.
- Use words to explain your work, but do not be verbose. You do not have to follow each algebraic manipulation with a sentence, but do not just write equations either.
- When you are unable to finish a problem indicate what you are stuck on. This will help me give you partial credit.
- Leave room between problems and in the margins for comments.
- You are welcome to collaborate with other students, but you must write and hand in your own copy and you must list all of your collaborators. If I receive two assignments that are identical this could be considered plagiarism.
